


# Ripple As You Go

# addi® Hooks & Notions

3.75mm addi® Swing Hook.

Or size needed to obtain gauge

Tapestry needle.

All yarn and needles distributed by skacel collection, Inc.

# **GAUGE**

One Large Motif = 4" x 4"

To save time, check your gauge and read all instructions thoroughly before beginning.

# Designer's Notes:

- At the beginning of the round/row, use a ch1 to count as a sc, ch2 as a hdc, and ch3 as a dc, unless otherwise noted.
- Stitch count is found at the end of the row in parenthesis.

#### FINISHED DIMENSIONS:

Scarf (Stole): Length = 71.25" (71.25"), Height = 7.5" (13.5") - Shown in 'Stole' size.

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# **INSTRUCTIONS**

# Large Motif (Make 7)

Note: Beginning of the row chains are not included in instructions below, see designer notes above. All slip stitch joins are worked into the first stitch of the round.

Ch 6, sl st to first chain to form a circle.

Rnd 1: 20dc in circle, sl st to join (20 dc)


Rnd 2: [sc, ch6, sk 1 dc] around, sl st to join (10 ch-6 spaces)

Rnd 3: sl st into ch6 space, [4dc in ch6 space, ch2] around, sl st to join (10 ch-2 spaces)

Rnd 4: sc in each dc and ch around, sl st to join (60 sc)

Rnd 5: [sc, ch6, sk 2 sc] around, sl st to join (20 ch-6 spaces)

Break yarn leaving 6" tail to weave in.



# Small Motif (Make 12):

Begin with a magic ring.

Rnd 1: 12 dc in magic ring, sl st to join (12 st)

Rnd 2: [dc, ch1] around, sl st to join (12 dc; 12 ch-1 spaces)

**Rnd 3:** [dc in dc, ch-1, picot, ch1] around, sl st to join (12 dc; 12 picots)

Note: Small motifs will be joined to other motifs while working Rnd 4.


Motifs are connected in a [Large-Small - Small] pattern ending with a Large motif on the end. Refer to the image below.

Each motif is connected to another with a slip stitch in two consecutive ch-6 spaces. To work a ch-6 join: [ch-3, sl st to ch-6 space of the motif that you are joining to, ch-3].

When joining motifs make sure to leave 5 unworked ch-6 spaces between joins on the top of the large motifs and 11 unworked ch-6 spaces along the bottom. Leave 3 unworked ch-6 spaces on the top of the small motifs and 5 unworked ch-6 spaces along the bottom.

**Rnd 4:** [sc in dc, ch-6] around, working a ch-6 join in the appropriate spaces indicated above.

Break yarn leaving 6" tail to weave in.





**Body**:

Ch 366.

Row 1: (tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr) in 6th ch from hook, [sk 2 ch, tr] 5 times total, sk 2 ch, [tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr] in next chain, \*[tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr] in next chain [sk 2 ch, tr] 5 times total, sk 2-ch, [tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr] in next chain\* repeat from \* to \* until the end of the row, turn.

Row 2: sc in each tr and ch until the end of the row.


Row 3: (tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr) in first sc, [sk 2 sc, tr] 5 times total, sk 2 sc, [tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr] in next sc, \*[tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr] in next sc [sk 2 ch, tr] 5 times total, sk 2-ch, [tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr] in next sc\* repeat from \* to \* until the end of the row, turn.

Row 4: sc in each tr and ch until the end of the row.

For Scarf: You are complete for this week and will pick up next week at the joining row.

For Stole: Repeat Rows 3-4, 7 more times. You are complete for this week and will pick up next week at the joining row.

Joining Row: (charted directions on next page)

Note: You will be joining the motifs to the body of the scarf/stole in this round. It helps to align your joined motifs right side up with the top closest to the body, ready to be joined. Be careful not to twist the joined motifs as you join.

Row 1: [tr, ch-1, sl st to large motif in the fifth ch6 space before the ch6 space that is joined to the small motif, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, sl st to the next ch6 space of the large motif, tr] in the first sc, sk 2 sc, tr, sl st to the next ch6 space of the large motif, [sk 2 sc, tr] 3 times total, sl st to the next ch6 space of the large motif, sk 2 sc, tr, \*\*sk 2sc, [tr, ch1, sl st to the next ch6 space, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, sl st to the next ch6 space of the small motif, tr] in next sc, ch3, sl st around the joined chains of the small and large motif, sk 2 sc, tr, sl st to the same ch6 space of small motif as last join, [sk 2 sc, tr] 2 times total, sl st to next ch6 space, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, sl st to the next ch6 space of small motifs, ch3, [tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, sl st to next ch6 space of small motifs, ch3, [tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, tr, ch1, sl st to next ch6 space of small motif, sk 2 sc, tr] 2 times total, sl st to next ch6 space of small motif, sk 2 sc, tr, sl st to the same ch6 space of small motif, sk 2 sc, tr] 2 times total, sl st to next ch6 space of small motif, sk 2 sc, tr, sl st to the same ch6 space of small motif, sk 2 sc, tr] 2 times total, sl st to next ch6 space of small motif, sk 2 sc, tr, sl st to the same ch6 space of small motif, sk 2 sc, tr] 3 times total, sl st to the next ch6 space of the large motif, tr] in next sc, sk 2 sc, tr, sl st to the next ch6 space of the large motif, tr] in next sc, sk 2 sc, tr, sl st to the next ch6 space of the large motif, tr] in last sc
